ABOUT AUSTRALIAN DYSPHONIA NETWORK INC

THE AUSTRALIAN DYSPHONIA NETWORK WAS FORMED IN 2016 WITH THE PURPOSE OF **FUNDING RESEARCH** INTO DYSPHONIA CAUSES AND **MANAGEMENT; AND TO** PROVIDE SUPPORT TO **ALL AUSTRALIANS** WHO LIVE WITH A CHRONIC VOICE DISORDER.

The term 'dysphonia' simply means 'difficulty making voice sounds'. It is not a speech disorder, but rather a problem with the larynx (or voicebox), meaning that it can be difficult to be heard or understood.

Dysphonia can be a single primary diagnosis resulting from a neurological, structural or functional disorder, or it can occur as a result of other neurological conditions. It is difficult to diagnose and frequently misunderstood due to the complex nature of producing voice sounds.

Dysphonia can affect relationships, cause withdrawal from one's social life and impact on careers; it frequently leads to withdrawal, isolation and depression thereby reducing quality of life for individuals and impacting on productivity.

The Australian Dysphonia Network is the first of it's kind in Australia. It was established by people who live with the daily challenges of not being heard, and who are passionate about funding research into causes, management and new treatments; while simultaneously providing education for health professionals, raising public awareness and supporting those who are affected.

Due to the difficulty with accurate diagnosis, it is hard to know the actual number of people living with a chronic voice disorder. However, it is estimated that approximately 1% of the population (~240,000ppl) will be diagnosed with Spasmodic Dysphonia, a life changing neurological voice disorder; while up to another 5% (1.2mil) will have other forms of chronic dysphonia which will impact significantly on their quality of life.

OUR STORY SO FAR

Until just over one year ago, this Network was just a dream. In October 2015, with the support of a few key Voice Health Professionals, two 'vocally challenged' individuals hosted 'Dysphonia~ let's talk about it'... a forum for others affected by, or interested in, voice disorders.

For many people and their supporters, it was the first time they had met *others like them*...people who understood their daily frustrations. There were also the amazing voice health professionals who shared their time, their expertise and their compassion with no strings attached, just a desire to help us to better understand dysphonia ...and show their support to start making some noise about voice disorders here in Australia.

Coincidentally, two weeks prior to the forum, the ABC aired an episode of Australian Story which featured a story in which Aussie Rock sensation Jenny Morris, was coming to terms with a diagnosis of spasmodic dysphonia. The show highlighted the significant impact of a voice disorder, and Jenny's bravery in facing those changes. It also opened to door for many people who had previously suffered alone, to come forward and 'talk about it'.

We've come a long way since that day.

- October 2015... A committee of amazing, hard-working and vocally challenged folk with some brilliant and diverse skills was formed.
- February 2016... the <u>Australian Dysphonia Network</u> became an Incorporated and Registered entity (ABN61974274234)
- March 2016 ...awarded charitable status under the Australian Charities and Not For Profit Commission (ACNC)
- April 2016 ...Official Launch of the Network on World Voice Day.
- May 2016...Strategic Planning Day mission, vison, priorities and directions set.

ANDWhile all this establishing has been going on, we have....

- connected with Voice Health Professionals right across the country including Doctors, Speech Pathologists and supporting Voice Practitioners.
- established a close relationship with University of Newcastle and a research & development partnership with Western Sydney University.
- produced a range of downloadable information and free support resources.
- established a 'closed discussion group' to connect and support people who are affected.
- responded to individual email requests for information, from health professionals and affected people who require information, referral or support - connecting people and strengthening the network.
- established an active Facebook presence to share public information.
- had many thousands of unique visitors to the website
