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In five years the number of older woman experiencing homelessness has increased by 31% to close to 7,000 in 2016, Census data shows.

In 2016-17 more than 13,000 women accessed specialist homelessness services nearly 20,000 times.

Tiny Homes Foundation is an Australian not-for-profit organisation dedicated to providing socially, environmentally and economically sustainable affordable housing solutions and support for people experiencing homelessness.

Our pilot tiny home project, an Australian first, was completed in May 2018 and now homes four disadvantaged young people who are supported in their tenancies by a local homelessness support service.

By collaborating with Councils, Social Housing Providers and Support Service Agencies, we can increase the supply of safe, affordable, and dignified housing for people experiencing or at risk of homelessness.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- The project will consist of two self-contained tiny houses constructed of two pods each a kitchen/lounge pod and bedroom/bathroom pod.
- Sustainably designed and oriented to maximise year round livability.
- · Designed to meet Livable Design Guidelines.
- Each tiny home will approximate 35m² and be connected to mains electricity, water and sewer.
- Instrumental in the success of the original pilot project was the collaborative relationships fostered between Tiny Homes Foundation, landowner (Central Coast Council), social housing provider (Pacific Link Housing), social service support (Coast Shelter) and many other organisations (see our website for a full list of partners).
- Will integrate employment and skills training development through parttime apprentice and possible Work-for-the-dole participation.
